**NOTICE OF ORAL ARGUMENT**

**Requests to reschedule arguments must be made by written motion in compliance with Administrative Order 15-01, a copy of which is available on the Court's website.**


The Court calendars and Oral Argument Procedural Guidelines can be viewed on this Court's website at: [www.5dca.org](http://www.5dca.org). Only parties who have filed briefs will be permitted to present Oral Argument.

In both civil and criminal appeals, argument is limited to 20 minutes per side. Multiple Appellants or Appellees must share the allotted argument time and so notify the Court prior to the commencement of oral argument. The presiding judge will allot time between multiple parties if the parties are unable to reach an agreement. Arguments are generally webcast and archived on the Court's website.

If the case is settled or to be voluntarily dismissed, counsel for the Appellant should notify the Clerk's Office promptly.

As you may know, students of various ages attend Law Day oral arguments. To further their education about the law and the judicial process, the Court allows the students to ask the attorneys questions at the conclusion of each argument. Questions may be general in nature or specific to your case. Please plan to stay for the question session at the end of your argument to the Court.
